

How and Where to go for Grievance Procedures, Appeals, and Complaints

There are several different policies for students to grieve, appeal grades or for academic conduct.

Students

1. Student Grievance – Student may grieve for grades, dismissal or failure to pass a comprehensive exam. This usually involves unfairness or fault of others.

2. Appeal of dismissal to Academic Policy Committee: Student who do not meet the academic standards may appeal for consideration to continue in their program because of extenuating circumstances. They do not imply fault or unfairness of others. Policy regarding appeals can be found here:

3. Honor Code/ Academic Code of Conduct: Students found in violation of the academic code of conduct (e.g., cheating or plagiarism) are governed under these rules:
